OUR MONTHLY MEETINGS

Carers 4 Carers' monthly meetings take place on the **fourth** Friday of the month. We meet at the Kineton Village Hall, Mill Street, Kineton, CV35 OLB between 10.30 and 12 noon. We always start with time for coffee and chat and then, if a speaker or workshop is scheduled, this will usually begin at about 11 o'clock. Come when you can and stay for as long as you are able.

are on our guard.

February 22nd—This will be a visit from our local Parkinson's Disease adviser, Rekha Tanna Hirani. She will be explaining the many ways in which support is available. Parkinson's is such a complex disease that the various elements touch on a wide range of situations common to many other conditions.

March 22nd— A meeting without a speaker so a chance to relax and enjoy some precious moments with our therapist, Anita. More details of any other activities available nearer the time.

COMPANIONSHIP GROUP INFORMATION FORMS

Anyone attending the Companionship Group, or their carer, is asked to complete a confidential form providing us with the necessary information to ensure we offer appropriate and safe care. We have recently revised the form to take into account new requirements in data protection and also make some items clearer. The information you provide needs to be updated regularly to reflect any changes in condition and needs.

We shall therefore be asking all carers whose loved ones attend the group to complete a new form over the next few months.

ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY

Warwickshire County Council has recently run a pilot scheme to explore the effectiveness of a range of assistive technology items. Of the huge variety of products now available, many can offer the carer a chance for short respite breaks, knowing that they will be alerted if there is a problem. E.g a GPS gadget that fits in the shoe alerts the carer if their loved one wanders outside a certain area.

This week I received information from Carers UK of a system developed with Hive. Hive products include plugs, lights and sensors that can be controlled by your phone. The new Hive Link alerts the carer if their loved one is not following their usual routine or if, for example, the front door has been left open longer than normal. This would be invaluable to carers who do not live with the person they care for or would allow them to go out.
